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## Curriculum

The curriculum is everything that is provided for our pupils. Our whole school curriculum aims to prepare pupils for learning beyond the school day and for adulthood. Pupils will develop their skills, knowledge and understanding in 4 key areas

- communication
- behaviour and awareness
- movement and co-ordination
- thinking skills and problem solving

## Topics

Key Skills are taught through curriculum areas or subjects and these are dependent on the phase of school that your child is in.

At the beginning of every term you will be sent curriculum information about the broad learning opportunities that your child will have. You will also be sent a timetable to show what lessons your child has each week in school.

## Learning Maps

At the beginning of every term we will also send home your child's learning map. This will tell you what your child will be specifically taught each term.

You will see that we have also written Home Learning targets on the Learning Map. We would really encourage you to work on these with your child at home.

## Progress

At the end of every term we will send home a Learning Journey which contains photos to show your child's participation in activities and which outlines the progress that they have made. We will also have a review meeting each year where we will discuss your child's progress and you will be invited to a celebration day in summer term where you can meet with the team and discuss your child's achievements over the course of the year.
